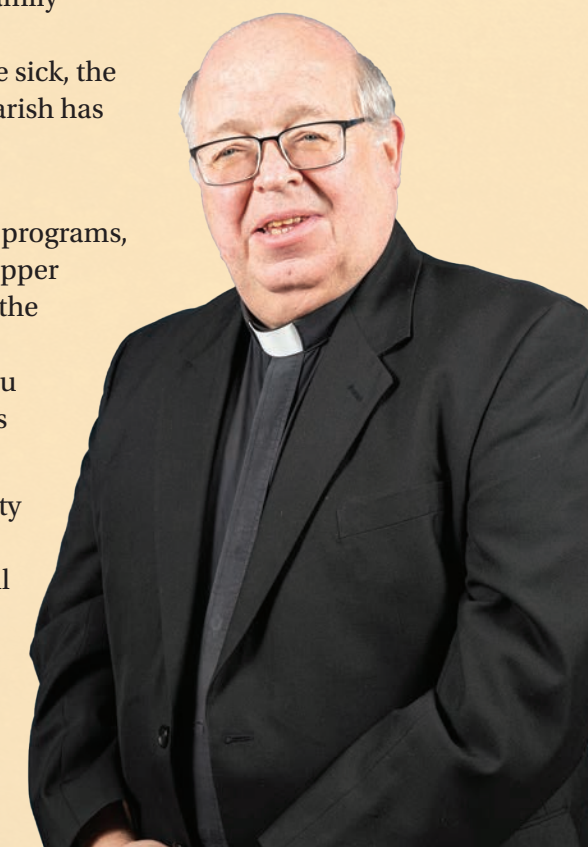

His Holiness Pope Leo XIV, Supreme Pontiff of the Universal Church

Pope Leo XIV, elected in 2025 as the first American Pope, hails from Chicago. Before his election, he was Cardinal Robert Prevost. Known for his pastoral heart, theological clarity, and commitment to evangelization, Pope Leo brings a renewed focus to the vital role of the parish in the life of the universal Church. Pope Leo spent more than two decades in Peru, where he became a naturalized citizen and served as a missionary and Bishop. He is fluent in English, Spanish, Italian, French, and Portuguese, and also reads Latin and German.



The Most Reverend Larry J. Kulick, J.C.L., Bishop of Greensburg

Bishop Larry J. Kulick, J.C.L., is the sixth Bishop of Greensburg, having been appointed by Pope Francis on December 18, 2020, and consecrated on February 11, 2021. He is the first native Bishop of the Diocese, hailing from Leechburg. His episcopal motto is *Christus est veritas* ("Christ is the truth"), reflecting his deep devotion to truth rooted in the Gospel. He is steadfastly committed to strengthening and nurturing our parishes, ensuring they remain vibrant centers of faith and service for generations to come.



Father Paul A. Lisik, V.F., Pastor

Father Paul A. Lisik, a native of Youngwood, was ordained in 1981. He has served as Parochial Vicar and Pastor in numerous parishes throughout the Diocese. Currently he serves as Vicar Forane (Dean) of Deanery VI and Pastor of Saint Aloysius Parish; Immaculate Conception, Saint John the Evangelist, and Saint Rita Parishes in Connellsville; Saint Joseph Parish in Everson; Saint John the Baptist Parish in Scottdale, and Saint Pius X and Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parishes in Mount Pleasant. With more than 40 years of ministry, Father Lisik continues to serve the Diocese and his communities with care and dedication, supporting the spiritual growth of his parishioners and guiding them on their faith journey.



Father Peter Guardiano, Parochial Vicar

Father Peter Guardiano is from the Diocese of Tagum in the Philippines. Ordained to the priesthood April 26, 2011, he served there as a Parochial Vicar, Spiritual Director, and parish Priest. He currently is Parochial Vicar to Saint Aloysius Parish; Saint John the Baptist Parish in Scottdale; Saint Joseph Parish in Everson; Saint Rita, Immaculate Conception, and Saint John the Evangelist Parishes in Connellsville; and Saint Pius X and Visitation Parishes in Mount Pleasant. With a heart devoted to Christ and His people, he strives each day to be a faithful witness to the Gospel and a servant of God's love.



Father Edwin Rubido, Parochial Vicar

Father Edwin Rubido was ordained to the priesthood April 6, 2005. He is from the Diocese of San Jose de Antique in the Philippines, where he faithfully served as a Parochial Vicar, Spiritual Director, and parish Priest. In 2024, he was assigned as Parochial Vicar to Saint Aloysius Parish; Saint John the Baptist Parish in Scottdale; Saint Joseph Parish in Everson; Saint Rita, Immaculate Conception, and Saint John the Evangelist Parishes in Connellsville; and Saint Pius X and Visitation Parishes in Mount Pleasant. Rooted in prayer and committed to his vocation, he strives to bring Christ's love to all he serves, walking with his parish communities in faith, hope, and joy.



Father Julius Capongpongan, Parochial Vicar

Father Julius Capongpongan is from the Diocese of Tagum in the Philippines and was ordained to the priesthood April 24, 2006. A Call to Serve

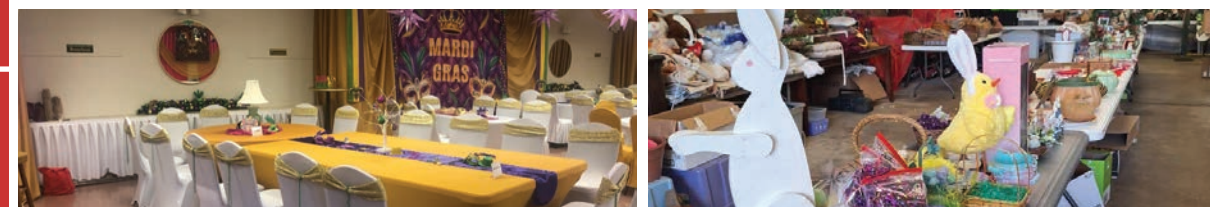
