The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

(CGS) is a faith formation experience for children ages 3 to 12 years old. It is based on the belief that young children can and do experience God. Founded on the educational principles of Maria Montessori, CGS is rooted in scripture and liturgy. Central to the Catechesis is the atrium, a special environment created to nurture the child's spirituality with beautiful materials that focus the child's attention on key scripture passages and liturgical moments. Children enter into a love relationship with Jesus, the Good Shepherd, through gospel proclamation (life of Jesus, parables), prayer, song, silence, and liturgical celebrations. Hands-on materials (made by catechists and parish members) allow children to reflect on God's love and many gifts.

The catechesis began in Rome in 1954 and has continued with the approval of the bishops of Rome. Dr. Sofia Cavalletti, a scripture scholar, and Gianna Gobbi, a Montessori teacher and trainer, developed the Catechesis through their observation and work with children. CGS can be found in parishes and schools throughout the world. Since 2007, all Missionaries of Charity (Mother Teresa's order) worldwide have adopted CGS for their work with children and the religious formation of new sisters.

Completion of the entire course is required for **Level 1 certification** by The National Association of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.

[Catechists in the Diocese of Pittsburgh will receive catechetical certification along with completion of the Morality Course.]

This course is designed to attune participants to the religious life of children 3-6 years old and to provide specific methods and materials to foster their spiritual life.

A formation course for Level I includes at least 90 hours of presentations and reflections which model the presentations for children. Adult reflections lead to a deeper understanding of the Bible and the Holy Mass. We will do some material making as well as practicing presentations (lessons).

Completion of the entire course plus time observing in an atrium are required for Level I certification by the National Association of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.

The Course Fee is \$375 for each part and must be paid before each part begins. The fee covers:

- All course sessions
- Three required textbooks
- Handouts
- Certificate from National CGSUSA

Participants from the Diocese of Greensburg may request scholarship. Those in the Diocese of Pittsburgh may apply for a scholarship for catechetical certification and professional development. Participants from other Dioceses should check their own diocese for grant money or apply for a partial scholarship through the national association (if already a National CGS member).
