Jesus' law of love is to love one another as Jesus loves each of us. Jesus teaches that we should love and forgive our enemies. The bishops are the successors of the Apostles. The Church's mission is to share Jesus' Good News with people of all nations. The Church is catholic because it is everywhere and welcomes everyone. God's gift of faith, hope, and love/charity are virtues that help you live a good and moral life. The apostles are the first leaders of the church. Review the 10 commandments.
